TIMING SERVICES AND ENTRIES

- PT Timing will seed the meet and post entry lists and results on line as soon as possible.
- Online entries must be completed 2 days prior to the event. This date is Tuesday, May 6 at 11:59pm CST.
- Coaches should register their athletes by visiting www.pttiming.com.
- Each team will be allowed the following entries per event:
 - No more than 3 individuals per team for any individual event
 - No more than 28 individual entries per team
 - One team per relay event
 - Changes at Coaches' Meeting take precedence with approval of the Meet Manager.
- Scoring will consist of 8 places.
- Please send an entry fee of \$200 to Seymour High School.

AWARDS

- Team trophies will be presented to the winners of the girls' and boys' teams immediately after the meet.
- Medals will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in each event.
- Individual award envelopes must be picked up immediately after the meet from the press box.

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COACHES' MEETING

- A coaches' meeting will be held at 3:00pm in the garage bay behind concessions.
- A participant may be replaced, but may not be dropped from one event and put into another event.
- Starting heights will be determined upon checking entry forms for the high jump and pole vault.
- The 10 minute checkout rule will be strictly enforced.

FACILITIES

- Track is a sealflex surface, 3/16" spikes may be used.
- Tent city is located just west of the concession stand on the opposite side of the fence.
- Warm-up areas:
 - West of the stadium on opposite side of the fence
 - Immediately north of the track
- Bathrooms and concessions are on site just south of stadium seating.
- Bullpen is at the north end of the track near the start of the 100.
- No locker rooms are available. Come dressed.
- Infield must be cleared of athletes during the meet

ATHLETIC TRAINER

ORDER OF EVENTS

3:30 PM

- Boys' Wheelchair Shot Put, then girls' shot put – will be conducted in flights with time limits with 9 participants (per division) to final; then followed by boys. In order to offer finals for both small and larger divisions, we will utilize both rings. Large schools will throw in one ring and small schools in the other.
- Boys' Discus – will be conducted in flights with time limits with 9 participants to final (per division), then followed by girls. In order to offer finals for both small and larger divisions, we will utilize both rings. Large schools will throw in one ring and small schools in the other. The space between the two rings must stay clear. No one should be past the marked areas. Those

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individuals helping to retrieve implements should stay to the outside of both vectors combined.

- Girls' High Jump, then boys – starting heights determined at coaches' mtg
- Boys' Pole Vault, then girls – starting heights determined at coaches' mtg
- Long and Triple Jumps will be open pit for trials (3:30-5:30)
- Girls' Long Jump – 9 participants to final (per division), then boys – one of 2 runways (either open pit finals or 45 min per gender)
- Boys' Triple Jump – 9 participants to final (per division), then girls – one of 2 runways
